



Customer Class Rate Impact Analyses**

**Residential Class**

Under the Settlement Rates, the monthly residential distribution customer charge will increase \$2.14 (or 26.4%) from \$8.11 to \$10.25. This increase in the distribution customer charge is in lieu of the Company's proposed monthly distribution customer charge of \$13.29, which represents a \$5.18 increase (or 63.9%). In addition, under the Settlement Rates, the bill for a typical Residential customer that uses 1,000 kWh per month will increase by \$12.70 per month, from \$116.56 to \$129.26<sup>1</sup> (or 10.9%), including default service generation, taxes and other rider surcharges. In comparison, in the Company's proposed filing, the bill for a typical Residential customer that uses 1,000 kWh per month would have increased by \$20.78 per month, from \$116.56 to \$137.34<sup>2</sup> (or 17.8%), including default service generation, taxes, and other rider surcharges.

**Commercial Class**

Under the Settlement Rates, the monthly distribution customer charge for a Rate Schedule GS Medium, three-phase customer will increase \$12.77 (or 59.3%) from \$21.52 to \$34.29. This increase in the distribution customer charge is the same as the monthly GS Medium, three-phase distribution customer charge in the Company's proposed filing. In addition, under the Settlement Rates, the bill for a typical Rate Schedule GS Medium, three-phase customer with monthly billing demand of 40 kW and 250 hours use of demand will increase by \$32.74 per month, from \$886.40 to \$919.14 (or 3.7%), including default service generation, taxes and other rider surcharges. In comparison, in the Company's proposed filing, the bill for a typical Rate Schedule GS Medium, three-phase customer with monthly billing demand of 40 kW and 250 hours use of demand would have increased by \$63.64 per month, from \$886.40 to \$950.04 (or 7.2%), including default service generation, taxes, and other rider surcharges.

**Industrial Class**

Under the Settlement Rates, the monthly distribution customer charge for a Rate Schedule TP customer will increase \$2,647.84 (or 300.2%) from \$882.16 to \$3,530.00. This increase in the distribution customer charge is in lieu of the Company's proposed monthly distribution customer charge of \$1,149.15, which represents a \$266.99 increase (or 30.3%). In addition, under the Settlement rates, the bill for a typical TP customer with monthly billing demand of 20 MW and 474 hours use of demand will increase by \$5,859.36 per month, from \$444,862.24 to \$450,721.60 (or 1.3%), including default service generation, taxes and other rider surcharges. In comparison, in the Company's proposed filing, the bill for a typical Rate Schedule TP customer with monthly billing demand of 20 MW and 474 hours use of demand would have increased by

\$9,278.51 per month, from \$444,862.24 to \$454,140.75 (or 2.1%), including default service generation, taxes, and other rider surcharges.


