


Comments to The Commission's Regulation Governing the Consumer Advisory Council, 52 Pa.Code Ch. 91; L-2018-3004948, Advance Notice of Proposed Rulemaking [48 Pa.B. 7122] [Saturday, November 10, 2018]

1. Chapter 91 has not been updated since 1994 and any changes need to provide protection on matters of consumer interests; safety, security, privacy.
2. How the Commission may better serve the public is by providing two(2) or preferably three(3) CAC Town Hall mtgs. for constituents at various meeting sites, each month. At least One to be held in the AM and at least one in the PM to meet the needs of working constituents. Meeting schedule will be made as public as possible, via a CAC media website, local radio channel, at all Post Offices in the jurisdiction, at all Police Stations in the jurisdiction, and at all Public Libraries in the jurisdiction. Notes on each schedule will reflect the CAC and Commission staff who will be present, the location, date and time of meeting in both English and the native language of the various constituents. A Report of Consumers Concerns for each meeting will be provided to both the Commission and the public at the sites where meeting schedule is posted. During such meetings the public can voice their concerns, and request the Council's support.
3. The Council should be empowered and explicitly authorized to file comments in public proceedings.
4. The Diversity obligation will allow for low-income consumer's interests and low -income consumers to be sought directly for Council membership. Appointments by Governor, Lieutenant Gov., General Assembly should not be derived from corporate organizations which would pose a conflict of interest in serving consumer's rights, for example, the Commonwealth of PA is the only state in this country mandated to install a smart meter on each home, no matter how disabled the person living within the building. This is wrong. Each person has the right to live free from harm and the smart meters do harm. by emitting toxic levels of non- ionizing electromagnetic fields not just inside of the house but outside of the house, passing into the next house, causing extremely high levels of electromagnetic radiation. A Bill to provide a true Electromechanical Analog meter will give all Pannsylvanians the right to peace and safety in their homes. Appointments should proportionately reflect the diverse members of the jurisdiction in ethnicity and wage-earning status.
5. The Commissions approval should not be a prerequisite to a Council member speaking in public about the work of the Council. There should be transparency and faith that members of the Council and Commission are working on behalf of the consumers and not otherwise.
6. Council members who do not attend two general meetings per month should be replaced. It is not fair to consumers to have members in the Council who do not respect their responsibility to attend meetings and vote.




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
